From the Pastor

Dearest Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

Today we begin the season of "Advent"; that season of preparation for the coming of Christ. Now, why didn't I just say "Christmas"? For the very simple reason that these first weeks of Advent are not about celebrating something that happened 2,000 years ago, but are for preparing for that coming of Christ that is to come. Listen to the readings and to the prayers over these next weeks. Discuss them at home with your family and out and about with your friends. Allow Advent to be Advent, that is, allow this season of preparation to be a season in which we prepare for the coming of Christ in Glory – whether that be at the end of time or simply (as for most of us) the end of our lives.

This will not take away from the "magic" or joy of the season. Indeed, it will strengthen and multiply the magic and joy *exponentially!* How is that? In preparing ourselves well for the coming of Christ in glory we will find ourselves better able to appreciate the fuller impact of his first coming in the stable at Bethlehem. Mere tradition, emotion, and nostalgia are replaced with the full impact of the reality of the Eternal Word becoming *incarnate!*

In the Church's long tradition these first days (weeks) of Advent are a time of prayer, fasting, and preparation; a kind of little lent. I would encourage everyone to do your very best at making these first couple of weeks a time of real and spiritual preparation for celebrating the mystery that is to come. I know. There are a lot of parties that, being social obligations, necessitate your presence. There is also a lot of preparing for family celebrations of Christmas. I get all of that. I do however encourage you to do what you can. The return, especially over time, is priceless.

In the Church's tradition we turn our attention to preparing for the celebration of our Lord's birth on December 18 – the *octave* of preparation for this second greatest feast

Baptism: Because we believe in the ordinary necessity of Baptism for salvation, it is customary that newborns be baptized as soon as is practical, usually within a month after birth. Parents need to attend baptism preparation with Deacon Sam prior to scheduling a baptism. Please contact the parish office for details or to register.

Marriage: Couples should contact the Pastor at the time of formal engagement or at least eight months prior to the desired date of the wedding. In the case of a mixed marriage, the non-Catholic party must arrange to receive instructions about the Catholic faith prior to the celebration of the sacrament.

of our salvation (Yes, Easter will always come first). Then the greens come out signifying new and eternal life; Ribbons and candy canes appear signifying the dual nature of the *Good Shepherd*; then, on Christmas Eve the lights go on signifying the coming of the *Light of the world* piercing the darkness (both literally and figuratively).

In discussing Christmas with our young people in past years, I have been astounded at how few of them really know the story of our salvation. Even the Christmas story is barely known or so mixed with popular, cultural riffs on the account of our Lord's birth that the real message is lost. I would encourage families to prepare by reviewing the readings for Sunday Mass; discuss them with family and friends (I know, it's becoming a refrain), and bring them to prayer. In doing so, you, your family and friends will learn the stories, and in learning the real story you will come to LOVE the story, and before you know it you will be LIVING the story. What does it mean to "live" the story? Very simply, it means living our faith, a faith which leads to eternal salvation (happiness), and even in this life brings a fullness and joy that most people only wish for.

A play / movie that I have always appreciated is "Mame!" The title character has a favorite saying which is, "The world is a banquet, and most poor [people] are starving to death". That is the way I have more and more begun to see our living of the faith. Half measures and hedging our bets won't do. So let us begin with preparing for the coming of the Lord and then celebrating Christmas (assuming He hasn't come in glory by the 18th) even more fully.

Think about it; bring it to prayer; discern what God is calling YOU to do. We'll see you next Sunday.

First Sunday in Advent

The Advent Wreath

The Advent wreath is part of our long-standing Catholic tradition that we use as part of our spiritual preparation for Christmas. We use candles for light signifying the coming of Christ Who is the Light of the world. The light shines in the darkness, which is most evident during this



time of year which is darker due to shorter daylight hours. The wreath is made of various evergreens, symbolizing continuous life. The prickly leaves remind us of the crown of thorns. The circle of the wreath, which has no beginning or end, represents the eternity of God, and the everlasting life found in Christ. The four candles represent the four weeks of Advent. A tradition is that each week represents 1000 years, to sum to the 4,000 years from Adam and Eve until the Birth of the Savior. The purple candles in particular symbolize the prayer, penance and preparatory sacrifices and good works undertaken at this time. The rose candle is lit on the third Sunday. In family practice, the Advent wreath is most appropriately lit at dinner time after the blessing of the food. A traditional prayer service using the Advent wreath proceeds as follows: On the First Sunday of Advent, the father of the family blesses the wreath, praying: "O God, by whose word all things are sanctified, pour forth Thy blessing upon this wreath, and grant that we who use it may prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ and may receive from Thee abundant graces. Who lives and reigns forever. Amen." He then continues for each of the days of the first week of Advent, "O Lord, stir up Thy might, we beg thee, and come, that by Thy protection we may deserve to be rescued from the threatening dangers of our sins and saved by Thy deliverance. Who lives and reigns forever. Amen." The youngest child then lights one purple candle, each day of the week until the next Sunday. Watch the bulletin next week for the prayer during the second week of advent.

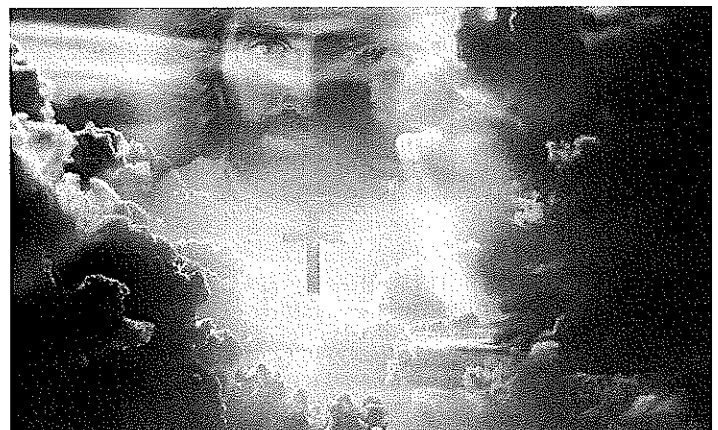

December-the Month of the Coming of Christ



For Youth and Young Adults

As we begin the month of December our next virtue is also very fitting for this time of year. Our virtue to practice especially this month is the virtue of generosity. Generosity means that we give without counting the costs. How often do we "give" something but then wonder what's in it for us? Is this generosity? As we continue to learn this virtue, we will come to know true generosity and what it really means in our lives.

As a basic introduction, are there ways that your family gives to those less fortunate throughout the year? Do you often donate to places like the Cashton Cupboard and Closet? Do you sponsor a child from Casa Hogar or find ways to send needed items down? Has your family participated in the various parish activities offered for the less fortunate such as sock drives or other such programs?

Does your family do something more specifically during the holiday season? Maybe you get a name from a giving tree or maybe you secretly bless a family that you know is in need. Is generosity a virtue that should only be practiced during the holidays? What are some other times that require extra generosity from others? (We did have some instances in our country in the last few months that required generosity from others. Do you remember what they were?)

Practicing true generosity means we don't count the costs. What exactly does this mean? If we decide to donate money, we don't mope around when we don't have "extra" to spend on something we don't need. For example, maybe you have \$15 and you give \$10 to a special cause. You have \$5 left and your friends want you to go see a movie, but you don't have enough money now. True generosity would expect that you'd be ok to go without the movie. If we struggle with generosity, we might mope and pout about not being able to go. Another example might be that you offer to help with the dishes even though it's your sibling's turn. You offer just because you feel like being nice and generous. True generosity would leave it at that. If we are struggling with generosity, we might say that the sibling has to do our turn at the dishes because we did theirs instead.

True generosity is giving for the sake of giving. As we continue to learn more about generosity, think about whether this requires just "stuff" like clothes or money, or can we also be generous with our time or in other ways? What does that look like? In what other ways can we be generous?
