From the Administrator

Thus Begins the Season of Holy Lent

It is that time of the year again to prepare for Lent. During this holy season, we are called to increase our time of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Here are some simple pointers:

Prayer - it is good to increase your daily prayer time, even by 10 to 15 minutes. If you are not in the habit of daily prayer, now is a great time to start. Another suggestion is to arrive at Mass 10 to 15 minutes before it starts and to have the readings for Mass read beforehand.

Fasting - this should be sacrificial. You cannot fast from things that you have to do (e.g., students doing their homework). A good fast involves something that we genuinely enjoy and would miss (e.g., chocolate). A good fast also frees us to spend more time with God.

Almsgiving - this could be both money and time. A good practice is to combine fasting and almsgiving. For example, you could fast from your morning coffee or energy drink and divert the money saved to a charitable cause.

However you choose to pray, fast, or give alms, the main goal is that it should increase your love for God and for your neighbor. Lent should be a holy experience. We are called to be holy like God is holy, that is, we are called to be like God. Jesus showed us how. He prayed, fasted, and gave regularly. To be holy is to be different, to be set aside. We should not be like the culture; we are called to holiness, to be like God.

Pastoral Notes Regarding the Season of Lent

Days of Abstinence - Throughout the year, Catholics are required to abstain (to deprive oneself) from something on Fridays. During the Season of Lent, Catholics are required to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and on Friday. This applies to those who are aged 14 and older, although those who are younger than 14 years of age may participate.

Days of Fasting - Catholics who are aged 18-59, although other ages may participate, are required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday (except for medical and health reasons). Fasting means no more than one full meal. Although Ash Wednesday falls on Valentine's Day, there is no dispensation from the day of abstinence and fasting. In other words, Ash Wednesday takes precedence over Valentine's Day. I suggest celebrating Valentine's Day the night before.

Baptism: Because we believe in the ordinary necessity of Baptism for salvation, it is customary that newborns be baptized as soon as is practical, usually within a month after birth. Parents need to attend baptism preparation with Deacon Sam prior to scheduling a baptism. Please contact the parish office for details or to register.

Marriage: Couples should contact the Pastor at the time of formal engagement or at least eight months prior to the desired date of the wedding. In the case of a mixed marriage, the non-Catholic party must arrange to receive instructions about the Catholic faith prior to the celebration of the sacrament.







For Youth and Young Adults

St. Kateri Tekakwitha is the patroness of the environment. I suppose this seems particularly fitting as she was a Native American and they certainly tended to be more mindful of their surroundings and how they treated the land.

She was very young when her mother, father and brother all died of small pox. This also left her disfigured and half blind. She was raised, then, by her uncle. During her youth, the Jesuits had started their missionary work among the natives. At the age of 19, she refused to marry a Mohawk warrior and converted. She was baptized on Easter Sunday.

This conversion of hers, however, meant she would be a slave from then on. She refused to work on Sundays and therefore received no food on those days. Her faith was causing increasing opposition and danger for her so one night she stole away and began a 200 mile journey towards Montreal. After a few years under the guidance of a priest and an older woman, she decided at the age of 23 to take a vow of perpetual virginity. She would practice extreme fasting for the conversion of her nation.

She died the day before Holy Thursday when she was just 24 years old.

Kateri led a life full of challenges and struggles. She had real and true struggles. Were not talking about our cell phones not working or the internet being out. We're talking death, lack of food, long journeys, loneliness, but she always spent time in prayer, despite all this. Do we have the stamina to endure the real and true struggles of our lives and keep our eyes focused on God? Or do we give in to

the pressures and struggles? Do we try to remain a person of integrity or do we fold under pressure?

4K & 5K with Mrs. Klinge

Computers with Mrs. Passe

3rd & 4th grade continue to learn where all the keys are and accuracy tests are going up!

5th-8th are in the middle of a Google Doc scavenger hunt. Next week all students will begin a computer Lent project.

3rd & 4th with Miss Santas

In third and fourth grade this week, we enjoyed doing an escape room for a math class to practice our multiplication, we also learned how to solve problems using a function table. We started a new unit in science, we are learning all about our solar system. In English we are learning everything that a sentence needs in order to be a complete sentence.

5th-8th Math & Science with Mrs. Flock

This week the 5th Grade Math class is multiplying and dividing decimals by multiples of ten. The 6th Graders are finishing up their graphing chapter by using equations to formulate a chart and a graphing function. Grade 7 is finding the area and circumference of circles, while grade eight reviews and tests on the Pythagorean Theorem. In Science the 5th and 6th graders are studying matter and the 7th and 8th graders took time to look at bacteria from yogurt and mold from bread under the microscope. It is an amazing world under there!

5th-8th Literature & Spelling with Mrs. Slattery

We discussed Archbishop Barrons's questions, "Whom-or what-will I worship?" He said it's the most important question of our lives. Where do I spend my time & my treasure? What do I "worship" on Sunday's?

Religion with Mrs. Steger

Our short week worked well so that we could do our diocesan assessments for 5th and 8th grade. Every year, students in these grades complete this assessment. It is a standard, fill-in-the-bubble answer sheet with questions about all aspects of our faith. Students in 6th and 7th had the opportunity to catch up on work. With any class time remaining after the assessments, we did some virtue study and Lent preparation.

Atrium students worked on parables and more gesture work this week. Of course, as usual, students also got to work on any material they have already been shown.

Phy Ed with Mr. Steger

We used the unseasonably warm weather to work out outside last week. With movements that require equipment, such as mats, exercise balls, and padded boxes, the students are broken in to teams of two where they take turns with the movement, and rotate around so everyone gets a chance to do each movement. Having a teammate helps keep the students on task and motivated. Everyone loves shuttle runs and hates burpees.

Reading Reflections

Today's readings prepare us for the penitential season of Lent. In our Gospel, a leper knelt before Jesus and said, "If you wish, you can make me clean." Jesus reached out and touched this diseased man and healed him. He then encouraged the man to show himself to the priest and offer a cleansing, referencing the commands in the Law of Moses. By completing these rituals, this man is taking steps towards being reinstated into the community. Let us approach this holy season of Lent like the leper. By our faults, we have distanced ourselves from God and His community. The leper reminds us Who to go to so we might be healed. Let us approach the Lord this season on our knees, asking for forgiveness and healing from our offenses, saying, "If you wish, you can make me clean." Undoubtedly, if we have a contrite heart, Jesus will stretch out His hand in forgiveness, and His mercy will touch our lives. And like the leper, we, too, should go forth from being healed with a commitment to cleansing ourselves from the lasting effects of sin. Lent is a time to offer acts of reparation through Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving so that the Gracious Healer, Who sacrificed His life for our sake, in the hope He may purify us in all areas of our life and walk. This holy season of Lent is an opportunity to be healed and cleansed on our journey as disciples of Christ. Let us consider what we can do to offer acts of reparation so that we might be purified and one day partake in the resurrection of Christ

As with Jacob, we can say as we pray before the Blessed Sacrament, "Surely the Lord is in this place, and I did not know it." (Genesis 28:10-17)
