## *From the Administrator*

The First Sunday of Lent always recounts the temptation of Jesus in the desert. In Mark's Gospel, which we read this year, it is a brief snippet of what happened. The Spirit drove Jesus out into the desert, "and he remained in the desert for forty days, tempted by Satan. He was among wild beasts, and the angels ministered to him" (Mark 1:13, NABRE). In Matthew's and Luke's Gospel, there is a more detailed account of the event, including dialogue between Jesus and Satan. It is also fascinating to note that in all three Gospels the temptations follow Jesus' Baptism and precedes the beginning of Jesus' ministry.

In all things that Jesus did, our Lord is teaching us disciples how to live a holy life, that is, how to be holy as our Father is holy. Each of us has been baptized. Each of us has a ministry to which we are called. How do we do with the "between" part, that is, with the temptations?

The Devil hates that we are baptized because it means that we belong to God. We are His children through the spirit of adoption. The Devil does not want us to go to Heaven, so He tempts us to throw us off of our ministry. Our ministry is a way to sanctify ourselves. Satan even tempted Jesus thrice to throw Him off of His ministry.

Thus, our Lord prepared in the desert for forty days and forty nights. Time in the desert is a great way to learn more about oneself and to practice virtue. The desert is bare and silent. It opens one's heart, mind, and soul to prayer, meditation, and listening to God's voice. The desert penetrates to deeper levels of one's thoughts and even one's being. The barrenness even helps a person to resist temptation (because the temptations are not there) and to practice virtue (because what else is a person to do).

Thus, the season of Lent calls us to make space for our own desert. We must find a barren and silent place to listen to God and to do His will. The goal is always Heaven. Here are some words for this Sunday's Eucharistic preface:

"He consecrated through His fast the pattern of our Lenten observance and, by overturning the snares of the ancient serpent, taught us to cast out the leaven of malice...we might pass over at last to the eternal paschal feast."

**Baptism:** Because we believe in the ordinary necessity of Baptism for salvation, it is customary that newborns be baptized as soon as is practical, usually within a month after birth. Parents need to attend baptism preparation with Deacon Sam prior to scheduling a baptism. Please contact the parish office for details or to register.

**Marriage:** Couples should contact the Pastor at the time of formal engagement or at least eight months prior to the desired date of the wedding. In the case of a mixed marriage, the non-Catholic party must arrange to receive instructions about the Catholic faith prior to the celebration of the sacrament.

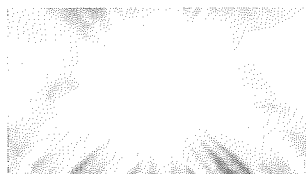
## THIS WEEK ON **FORMED**

## Art with Mrs. Leis

This week the students were required to create and use hearts of varying sizes and colors to create things found in the natural world. The assignment was challenging but should be helpful for our upcoming 3D projects. Additionally, several students completed their hot air balloons.

## 3rd & 4th with Miss Santas

In third and fourth grade this week, the third graders started working on fractions in math, while the fourth graders have been working on graphs in math; on Friday for math fun day, we played multiplication and division fact bingo. In science, we are learning all about our solar system. For social studies this week, we finished up the chapter reading about the Revolutionary War.

## 5th-8th Math & Science with Mrs. Flock

This week we are working on writing equations using the slope intercept form in eighth grade math. Seventh grade math is evaluating areas of parallelograms, triangles, trapezoids, and complex figures. In 5th grade we are finishing our unit on decimals by using conversion factors in the metric system. Sixth graders find themselves in a unit of area also. We are starting out by learning how to substitute values into the formulas to solve area problems. Science finds the 7th and 8th graders learning about protists while 5th and 6th graders are continuing their study of matter by examining the atomic theory.

## 5th-8th Literature & Spelling with Mrs. Slattery

5th & 6th grade students are looking forward to making gardens like the one in The Secret Garden. Our main character, Mary Lennox is beginning to come alive through the wind, the moor, the garden & the robin. 7th & 8th grade students just got Edward on the throne after his mistaken identity forced him to experience poverty, injustice & deceit. The lessons he learned will not be forgotten as England's new king in The Prince & the Pauper.

## Religion with Mrs. Steger

7/8 dove into the gifts of the Holy Spirit this week. Did you know there are 7 gifts? Did you also know that 7 is considered a perfect number? How amazing that God gave us 7 gifts at our baptism and increased these gifts at our confirmation! We also learned about the fruits of the Spirit. Do you know what the fruits are?

5/6 continued talking about John 6. "This is a hard saying." Many people didn't understand what Jesus was talking about when He said we needed to eat His flesh and drink His blood. And they left. The Apostles didn't really understand this either but they stayed because they knew Jesus had the words of eternal life. Which one are you?

Atrium students worked on more gestures and parables in anticipation of Lent starting. As always they worked on other materials they have been shown previously.

## Phy Ed with Mr. Steger

We've taken advantage of the nicer weather to get back outside for PE class. We are focusing on team workouts (generally 2 teams) consisting of rotations of shuttle runs, alternating lungs, burpees, and rest. Teams work together to rotate and transition between the movements and keep track of their team's total reps.

## First Sunday in Lent

### Reading Reflections

Today's readings remind us why we partake in this 40-day Lenten journey — to prepare our hearts for the resurrection of Christ on Easter. St. Peter reminds us in our Second Reading of the blessings we receive from Christ's passion, death, and resurrection — "Christ suffered for sins once... that he might lead you to God." And again, "[Baptism] is... an appeal to God for a clear conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ." To receive the blessings more readily from Christ's passion, death, and resurrection, we, too, must endure 40 days "in the desert." In our Gospel, the Spirit led Jesus into the desert, where Satan tempted him. Jesus was to face trials and to confront evil. During this time, He committed to intense prayer and fasting. Jesus did not need to go into the desert so that He might be purified but rather to endure the temptations of man for our sake. He was fully man and experienced temptations like us, yet responded perfectly, never falling into sin. We should strive to fully participate in this Lenten season by mirroring Jesus, the model steward by Whom we are to imitate. Through our time in the desert, we will confront evil by weeding out the roots of sin in our lives through fasting. And we will be sustained and nourished in the desert by prayer. Let us strive to purify our hearts so that we might be ready to receive the glorious gift of Christ and partake in the riches that pour forth from this Gift.

### A Minute with Jesus:

Jesus wants us to know He is continually with us. Oftentimes, our mind begins to wander at Mass because we only see bread and wine. What contributes to our distractions is the bombardment of noise and images in our minds that come through our physical senses (hearing, seeing). Therefore, we are much less attuned to the world of the spirit and the much deeper spiritual realities that are right here, all around us. Let's pray this right now and every day this week: Jesus, help me to learn to be quiet and reveal to my heart the truth that the Eucharist is really You present under the appearance of bread and wine. This week, read about Jacob in the desert, who was very much afraid, and came to realize that God was present right there with him. As with Jacob, we can say as we pray before the Blessed Sacrament, "Surely the Lord is in this place, and I did not know it." (Genesis 28:10-17)
