From the Administrator

Announcement! This is a reminder that for the next four weekends (now until February 3-4), I will not be here on the weekends. Before receiving my added assignment, I committed to helping out while the priests from India took their vacation back home. Please be welcoming and friendly to Fr. Dale Grubba, a retired priest from the Diocese of Madison as he takes care of you during this time.

As I am writing this, Monroe County is under a winter storm warning, and the schools in the area are closed. I appreciate a snow day because it means a quiet day free to get some work done.

Of course, snowy days can be mixed with reactions and feelings. For people who like white winters, it is about time that we get snow halfway through meteorological winter. It is an exciting welcome. On the other hand, people still must drive for work in this mess. Caution, I hope, takes over, but accidents occur. Furthermore, families now must figure out what to do with the kids who are not at school today.

Then again, this area of Wisconsin is accustomed to receiving snow, which is helpful for agriculture and the ecosystem. When the snow melts slowly in the spring, it replenishes the water sources and prepares for the new growth of spring. Also, snow provides new sources of activities and fun like skiing, snowboarding, sledding, snowmen, snow forts, and the like. This is a wonderful blessing for keeping the beauty of the Wisconsin landscape.

However, this is not a blessing for everyone. With the snow and the upcoming winter's revenge of an arctic cold blast, people without stable housing are greatly affected by these harsh weather conditions. Without a doubt, warming shelters will be filled beyond capacity this weekend. People will suffer, and volunteers will generously offer their time to help. Say a prayer or two for all affected.

What, then, ought to be our response? Is it a blessing or a curse? While in the fiery furnace, Hananiah, Azariah, and Mishael praise God by naming created things that bless the Lord - "Cold, chill, frost, ice, and snow, bless the Lord" (cf., Daniel 3). Our response should be like theirs. Recognize the reality that all is created by God, including the weather, and it does what it was created to do. By doing what it was created to do, it blesses the Lord. At the same time, recognize the reality that people are affected and that perhaps we are called to extend a helping hand. Then, we, too, will bless the Lord.

Baptism: Because we believe in the ordinary necessity of Baptism for salvation, it is customary that newborns be baptized as soon as is practical, usually within a month after birth. Parents need to attend baptism preparation with Deacon Sam prior to scheduling a baptism. Please contact the parish office for details or to register.

Marriage: Couples should contact the Pastor at the time of formal engagement or at least eight months prior to the desired date of the wedding. In the case of a mixed marriage, the non-Catholic party must arrange to receive instructions about the Catholic faith prior to the celebration of the sacrament.

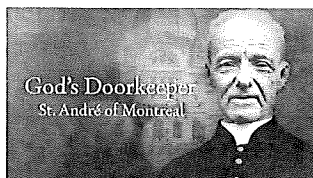
Visitation of the Sick: If you become hospitalized, institutionalized or homebound because of illness and would like communion brought to your home or just to be visited, please call the parish office.

Bulletin Deadline: Please submit items for publication in the weekly bulletin before 8am Wednesday.

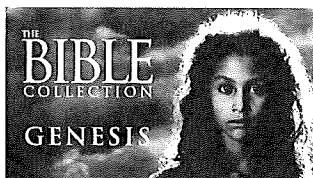

Our first saint in our study of gratitude is a saint who is usually pictured with animals. This may be a dead giveaway for many of you but for those who are still unsure of who our saint is, it is Saint Francis of Assisi.

Francis was born in 1181 in Italy to a wealthy family. And, as is common with most of our saints from wealthy families, Francis gave up all the wealth and everything else he had in order to follow God. This may bring to mind that passage from Scripture about passing through the eye of the needle and a rich person. If you don't know the passage, see if you can find it. I just might have a special something for the first to let me know what it is.

Continuing on, Francis is our saint for gratitude (seeing everything as a gift and being thankful) because he truly was thankful for everything. He made songs about the sun, moon, plants ani-

mals, everything in creation.

Francis also started the Franciscan Order. This order was created so the members could follow in the footsteps of Christ. Francis has become one of the most venerated saints and is also the first recorded person to have the stigmata, the wounds of Christ.



Looking through this little snippet of Francis's life, what parts could you also copy in your life? Are we always thankful? Or do we complain?

This time of year is a perfect time to look at whether we are truly thankful, especially when the weather is so cold, or when the sun doesn't shine for days or we have the after Christmas dreariness. How can we start to practice true gratitude? How will you start?

3rd & 4th with Miss Santas

In third and fourth grade this week, we finished up our chapter on learning about matter, and started reading about energy and heat. We had a discussion about crystals, then a few of the kids used a crystal growing kit that we will be able to watch the progress over the next week. We have been busy this week doing our testing on the computers. In Spanish this week, we learned how to say different school subjects and seasons of the year.

5th-8th Math & Science with Mrs. Flock

This week in Science 5th and 6th graders are studying properties of light, while 7th and 8th graders continue to study organic compounds and the many different structures isomers can take. 5th grade Math is calculating volume of cuboids while 6th grade is solving one step algebraic equations. 7th grade continues to work on pattern sequences and 8th grade is calculating slope, and writing line equations using the slope-intercept form.

5th-8th Literature & Spelling with Mrs. Slattery

The 5th & 6th graders are working with adjectives, that bounty of words that describe nouns in so many ways and places in our sentences. A review unit in spelling means we get a spelling bee this week. Yay!

Religion with Mrs. Steger

7/8 spent the week chatting about sacraments and learning about the form (the words) and the matter (the things) as well as the sacramental graces of each of the seven sacraments.

5/6 learned about the Beatitudes. Jesus gave us these exhortations (sayings) as a completion of the Old Law (the 10 Commandments). There is a common thread among both the 10 Commandments and the Beatitudes. If we love God and our neighbor, we are already working at both the Commandments and Beatitudes. Atrium students got settled back in after our Christmas break and learned various works like the visit of the Magi, the flight to Egypt and the Presentation in the Temple.

2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading Reflections

"Speak, for your servant is listening." With those few words, Samuel humbles himself and declares his loyalty and obedience to God. There are perhaps, for many of us, challenges in those words. Initially, Samuel responds, "Here I am," thinking Eli called him. Being a servant and being willing to serve may be a trial for us in how we live. Samuel does not recognize the voice of the Lord. That, too, might be a problem for us. First, we need to be listening. Are we listening, or are we merely going through the motions? Responding to God with "Here I am" is a magnificent way to react to God. It is not that God does not know where we are, but saying that can serve as a reminder that we are stewards and servants to Him, implying we are prepared to hear what He wants us to do. "Here I am" is said numerous times by those in the Old Testament, including Abraham, Jacob, Moses, and Isaiah, and by Ananias in the New Testament. When Jesus says, "Come follow me," as He does to us, do we hear Him, and even more importantly, do we respond and follow? To do that properly, we must be prepared to serve Him and others. Thus, like Samuel, we need to listen, and then we need to serve. Pope Francis said at a recent papal audience, "Love and charity are service, helping others, serving others. When you forget yourself and think of others, this is love!"
