From the Administrator

A Reading from an Ancient Homily for Holy Saturday

"What is happening? Today there is a great silence over the earth...a great silence because the King sleeps; the earth was in terror and was still, because God slept in the flesh and raised up those who were sleeping from the ages. God has died in the flesh, and the underworld has trembled.

Truly he goes to seek out our first parent like a lost sheep; he wishes to visit those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death...

The Lord goes in to them holding his victorious weapon, his cross... 'Awake, O sleeper, and arise from the dead, and Christ shall give you light.

'I am your God, who for your sake became your son, who for you and your descendants now speak and command with authority those in prison: Come forth, and those in darkness: Have light, and those who sleep: Rise...

'For you, I your God became your son; for you, I the Master took on your form; that of slave; for you, I who am above the heavens came on earth and under the earth...for you, who left a garden, I was handed over to Jews from a garden and crucified in a garden.

'Look at the spittle on my face...in order to restore you to that first divine inbreathing at creation...

'See the scourging of my back, which I accepted in order to disperse the load of your sins... See my hands nailed to the tree for a good purpose, for you, who stretched out your hand to the tree for an evil one.

'I slept on the cross and a sword pierced my side, for you, who slept in paradise...My side healed the pain of your side; my sleep will release you from your sleep in Hades; my sword has checked the sword which was turned against you.

'But arise, let us go hence. The enemy brought you out of the land of paradise; I will reinstate you, no longer in paradise, but on the throne of heaven. I denied you the tree of life, which was a figure, but now I myself am united to you, I who am life. I posted the cherubim to guard you as they would slaves; now I make the cherubim worship you as they would God.

"The cherubim throne has been prepared, the bearers are ready and waiting, the bridal chamber is in order, the food is provided, the everlasting houses and rooms are in readiness; the treasures of good things have been opened; the kingdom of heaven has been prepared before the ages."

Baptism: Because we believe in the ordinary necessity of Baptism for salvation, it is customary that newborns be baptized as soon as is practical, usually within a month after birth. Parents need to attend baptism preparation with Deacon Sam prior to scheduling a baptism. Please contact the parish office for details or to register.

Marriage: Couples should contact the Pastor at the time of formal engagement or at least eight months prior to the desired date of the wedding. In the case of a mixed marriage, the non-Catholic party must arrange to receive instructions about the Catholic faith prior to the celebration of the sacrament.

Happy Easter!!! Alleluia! We made it through Lent so now we can celebrate all that Jesus has done for us. Hopefully, even though we are celebrating. we don't fall back into bad habits (that we hopefully gave up during Lent) but continue to grow in His love and mercy through the remainder of this Church year. The chaplet of Divine Mercy, as well as the novena, help us to remember Jesus's ultimate sacrifice on the cross, even in this time of celebration. The chaplet is a simple meditation focusing on the Passion and Death of Jesus. It is a quick prayer said using the beads of the rosary to guide you.

On Good Friday, hopefully you all started the Divine Mercy Novena. This is a particularly good novena to pray as we remember Jesus's infinite mercy to us (especially fitting as we celebrate Easter). The novena was given to St. Faustina between the years of 1931 and 1938. She was an uneducated nun, and was therefore given the most mediocre jobs in the convent, such as in the kitchen and garden.

Our Lord appeared to St. Faustina numerous times. requesting a picture be painted (this is where we get the picture of Divine Mercy), which red and white rays shining down. The white rays stand for Water, which cleanses the soul, and the red symbolizes the Blood, the life of the soul.

St. Faustina was the first saint canonized in the new millennium, April 30, 2000 by John Paul II. Of course, this feast isn't solely about God's great mercy. It's also a gentle reminder to us to do the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. These are very simple ways we can be "like" Christ to others.

Hopefully we already do some of these naturally (or more specifically during Lent) but anytime is a good time to practice them.

Those are tough! It is so easy to hold a grudge and constantly remember what someone else did or said to you or about you. In this Easter season let us continually bring to mind God's great and lasting mercy.

Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of Our Lord

Reading Reflections

Today, we celebrate the Resurrection of Christ! Our readings today reveal how we can live out the joy of Easter all year long in our day-to-day lives. Our Gospel portrays the third day after Jesus' death when Mary of Magdala visits Jesus' tomb. Once she saw the stone removed, she ran to tell Simon Peter, and John. They also ran to the tomb, and upon seeing. they believed. We can tell much about these disciples' relationship with Jesus because of how they responded to the news about Him - they "ran." Mary didn't see the empty tomb and thought. "Someone else will figure it out." Peter and John didn't hear the news and thought, "I will check on it later." They each responded with conviction as they "ran" for Jesus. We must ask ourselves, "Do I have a relationship with Christ to the point where I am running to Him daily?" The way these disciples responded is how we should respond to Christ. We must avoid complacency, and as intentional disciples, we must stop rationalizing our choices by telling ourselves that we will someday get around to putting God first. Every moment throughout our day is an opportunity to respond to God in gratitude, compassion, and eagerness. Although there will be moments when we do not "feel" like responding to Him, it matters the most in those moments when we faithfully respond regardless of how we feel. Let us celebrate this glorious day with prayer and feasting, for Christ is risen! And let us strive to carry this Easter joy with us all year long by how we respond to Christ daily. Happy Easter!
