From the Pastor

Dearest Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

We have had quite a month...first the Sacred Heart Fall Fundraiser, then the Diocesan Annual Appeal, and then the annual Mission Appeal. MONEY, MONEY, MONEY! Or, at least, it *could* seem that way. One of the things that we need to remember about our Catholic faith is that it is a faith that is *lived*. This means that our faith is not just something we think about or relegate to a particular time of the day or week – our faith is (or should be) integral to everything that we do.

When I am preparing couples for marriage I generally have occasion to point out that even (especially?) their life of intimacy together is something in which God and therefore their faith is intimately involved. This is usually rather shocking to the couple sitting before me, but as we talk about the nature of marriage and our faith it generally becomes apparent to them that such is indeed the case!

So it is with our financial life. It seems very institutional and anything but spiritual, but the choices we make are always *moral choices*, and that includes the choices that we make concerning our financial life. That is why I frequently ask you to bring the decisions you are going to make about such financial dealings as your weekly stewardship in favor of your parish, your annual stewardship in favor of the work of the diocesan Church which is the most fundamental institutional division in the Church. Now how can I say that??? Isn't the "family" the most fundamental unit? And what about our parish? That's the "institution" within the Church with which I most identify.

While it is true that the family is the building block of society and that society

Sacramental Life

Baptism: Because we believe in the ordinary necessity of Baptism for salvation, it is customary that newborns be baptized as soon as is practical, usually within a month after birth. Parents need to attend baptism preparation with Deacon Sam prior to scheduling a baptism. Please contact the parish office for details or to register.

Marriage: Couples should contact the Pastor at the time of formal engagement or at least eight months prior to the desired date of the wedding. In the case of a mixed marriage, the non-Catholic party must arrange to receive instructions about the Catholic faith prior to the celebration of the sacrament.

we call “the Church”; and it is also true that our everyday association with the Church of Christ is in the context of our parish; we need to remember that our local “Church” is most fundamentally recognized as those who live the faith in communion with the diocesan bishop – in our case, Bishop Callahan. It is our bishop who holds the fullness of *Holy Orders* and as such is the one who sustains us in the apostolic faith, guides us in living that faith within the context of the time and place in which we live, and provides for us the sacramental life that sustains us.

We must always remember that our faith is a *relationship*, and as such it is handed on from person to person. While books, especially the Sacred Scriptures, will always be important, what is most important is the person-to-person relationship that is fostered through our knowledge of them – first with God (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit), and then with our neighbor.

As we move into the month of November we are going to be reminded again that this relationship does not end with our death. The relationships that are born of our baptism and following life of faith continue – that is the very core of the doctrine of the *Communion of the Saints*. Thus, in our celebration of All Saints, followed by our commemoration of the faithful departed (All Souls) we are reminded that our faith is lived in relationship with God and our neighbor which is why everything from finances, to marital intimacy, to Sunday (and Holy Day) Mass, to time for recreation matters.

“May Christ our Lord help us all with His bountiful grace, so that we may know His holy will and perfectly fulfill it.” (*St. Ignatius of Loyola*)

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its policies and procedures, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (employee, volunteers, vendors, religious or clergy). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to the Most Reverend William Patrick Callahan, Bishop of La Crosse, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Karen Becker, Victim Assistance Ministry, 608-519-8002 or kbecker@cclse.org. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of the Vicar for Clergy or on the diocesan website at: www.diolc.org. **Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities.** Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local parish and on the diocesan website. For Youth and Young Adults

During our study on the virtue of reverence, there was an introduction to sacramentals and some of the types of sacramentals that you might be familiar with. In this final column on reverence, we will cover more of the types of sacramentals as well as how to properly dispose of the various items, if necessary.

So, what exactly is a sacramental? According to the Catechism, sacramentals are "holy things or actions of which the church makes use to obtain for us from God, through her intercession, spiritual and temporal favors." Basically, this means that it is anything that is set apart to help us attain holiness or to practice a special devotion. Did you know that through the proper use of sacramentals we can get actual graces, forgiveness of venial sins, a removal of temporal punishment (what we owe for sins), protection from evil spirits and more? These items or devotions do not take the place of receiving the sacraments.

What sacramentals are NOT are good luck charms. Just because we wear a saint medal, a scapular, etc does not give us free reign to do whatever we want or guarantee that we will be in heaven. If we regularly use holy water, it doesn't automatically wipe away venial sin because we still need to be sorry for our sins first. The power of a sacramental depends a lot on the devotion of the priest as

well as the person receiving the sacramental at a minimum.

What are some of the types of sacramentals? Blessings are sacramentals. Exorcisms are another category or type of sacramental. One example of this is that this particular type can be placed specifically on a St. Benedict medal. A more obvious category would be blessed objects, which we mentioned earlier this month. Examples of this would be holy water, palms, crucifixes, rosaries, etc. When we bow our heads at the name of Jesus it is a sacramental as well.

How do we dispose of a material sacramental such as a scapular or rosary? First of all, don't throw it in the trash. Holy water can be poured into the earth, in a place where one would not walk over it. Things that are burnable such as a scapular or holy book should be burned, and then the ashes buried. Statues can be broken into smaller pieces and then buried. And, if you aren't sure, Father will take them and make sure they get buried properly.

Hopefully you have a newfound devotion and love for sacramentals and also a knowledge of how to dispose of those items you may have that are too worn or broken to use anymore.
