From the Administrator

The Ascension of the Lord

What is the Ascension of the Lord? What does the Ascension of the Lord mean as a mystery of our Faith? What do we celebrate on this great Solemnity?

Every Sunday and Solemnity as we profess our Faith in the Nicene Creed, we believe that "He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father." Why did Jesus ascend? The Catechism of the Catholic Church provides some answers in paragraphs 659 to 667. At the moment of His Resurrection, Christ's body was glorified. The Gospel readings within the Octave (first eight days) of Easter recounted how Jesus spent time with his disciples eating with them, teaching them, and preparing them for their mission. After forty days, Jesus ascends into heaven with "the irreversible entry of his humanity into divine glory" (659). This is to say that Jesus fully completes the mission to bring back humanity into full communion with God as He is the Way to the Father.

We, humanity, lack the power to access the Father's house, "to God's life and happiness" (661). As Jesus said, "Only the one who 'came from the Father' can return to the Father" (661, cf. John 16:28). Only God has the power to bring humanity back to Himself. In other words, Jesus came to Earth to lead humanity back to the homeland of Heaven, where God and happiness dwell. This gives us hope and confidence for our own journey to Heaven.

Furthermore, the Cross foreshadowed the "lifting up" of Jesus by His Ascension into Heaven. By these acts, Jesus desires to draw all men to Himself (662, cf. John 12:32). Now, is God truly "up there?" Strictly speaking, no, for God and Heaven are purely spiritual realities. They have no physical dimensions to use the description of up or down. However, we are physical beings, and it is natural to lift up our hearts, our voices, and our minds to spiritual things. Jesus is "up there" and sits at the right hand of the Father. He sits there with all the power, honor, and glory of His Father, and it is there that Jesus intercedes for us as the "mediator who assures us of the permanent outpouring of the Holy Spirit" (667). Let us meditate on this mystery of the Faith, giving thanks and glory for all that Jesus has done and does for us.

Sacramental Life

Baptism: Because we believe in the ordinary necessity of Baptism for salvation, it is customary that newborns be baptized as soon as is practical, usually within a month after birth. Parents need to attend baptism preparation with Deacon Sam prior to scheduling a baptism. Please contact the parish office for details or to register.

Marriage: Couples should contact the Pastor at the time of formal engagement or at least eight months prior to the desired date of the wedding. In the case of a mixed marriage, the non-Catholic party must arrange to receive instructions about the Catholic faith prior to the celebration of the sacrament.


Visitation of the Sick: If you become hospitalized, institutionalized or homebound because of illness and would like communion brought to your home or just to be visited, please call the parish office.


Deuteronomy | Old Testament: Book Overviews | The Bible Project

For Youth and Young Adults

St. Dominic was born in Spain and was trained for the priesthood by an uncle, who was also a priest. We don't know much about Dominic's early life but once he was ordained, he spent a fair amount of time trying to overcome a heresy of the time. He also spent time reordering the Cistercian order.

Dominic saw why the group of heretics were having so much luck so he came up with a way to combat them. He spent more time preaching, but not the way that was done by others. He did not spend time in the fancy hotels or wearing the best clothing, but instead depended on the generosity of others. Eventually, he and his fellow preachers became an order, the order of Preachers (Dominicans).

Legend has it that Dominic had a vision with himself and a stranger in it. The next day, Dominic was at church and a rugged beggar came in (the man from his vision). Dominic immediately embraced the man and said they needed to stick together for the salvation of the world. According to the legend, the beggar was St. Francis of Assisi.

Dominic spent years preaching. He was quite successful in the conversion of people, joining together the intellect

(the mind) as well as popular needs at the time. His feast day is August 8.

The Dominican ideal is meant for all of us, not just those in religious communities. It is a joining of both the active life as well as the contemplative (or thoughtful) aspects of our lives. In one sense it is about having our lives in proper balance. We don't spend our entire life in thought, nor in active work, but somehow we can do both.

Are our lives balanced? Do we need to spend more time in thought/prayer or in action? What is it that we can learn from St. Dominic?

To end out the year for English, we have been working on diagramming sentences. We have been busy in class working on our parts for the spring program and the Saint play the class will put on for the younger grades.

5th-8th Literature & Spelling with Mrs. Slattery

In history we've moved from WWI, The Great War, to WWII, an even greater war. In fact, "it was the greatest, bloodiest, & most destructive war ever fought in the history of mankind." Spelling is wrapping up! One more spelling bee to go....

5th-8th Science & Math with Mrs. Flock

Reading Reflections

We often cite Jesus' quote from today's Gospel of Mark: "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature." This remark was not a suggestion from the Lord. It was, quite frankly, a command, and it is one which still holds for each of us. Being an evangelist, being a disciple, being a steward is not a matter of choice for those of us who are Catholic and Christian. It is something the Lord expects of us. Often, we may like to spend time debating how to do that, but that does not lessen the fact that it is something we are supposed to do. We must acknowledge that even the original Apostles and followers of Jesus did not do that immediately. We learn that they stayed in Jerusalem for some time, and it seemed only when the Church and its followers were being persecuted that they began to reach out and truly share the "Good News." Once Christians accepted that charge from the Lord, they took the Word of God to all corners of the earth. Look at the Church today. It is incredible how this Church has grown from one Man/God and a small group into what it is today. That does not. however, get us "off the hook." As much as we may argue about how to carry out this command from Jesus, the fact remains that our very lives need to stand as a representation of what it means to be a Christian, what it means to "love one another," what it means to live and to work as a disciple of Christ.
