SACRAMENTAL LIFE

Baptism:

Because we believe in the ordinary necessity of Baptism for salvation, it is customary that newborns be baptized as soon as is practical, usually within a month after birth. Parents need to attend baptism preparation with Deacon Sam prior to scheduling a baptism. Please contact the parish office for details or to register.

Marriage:

Couples should contact the Pastor at the time of formal engagement or at least eight months prior to the desired date of the wedding. In the case of a mixed marriage, the non-Catholic party must arrange to receive instructions about the Catholic faith prior to the celebration of the sacrament.

Anointing of the Sick:



If you become hospitalized, institutionalized or homebound because of illness and would like communion brought to your home or just to be visited, please call the parish office.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Another Advent and Another New Year

Well, here it is! No, I am not referring to our new look for the bulletin. It is the First Sunday of Advent, the start of a new liturgical year. This year we will be listening to the Gospel of Luke, who wrote many very memorable parables for us to learn more about how to live more like disciples of Jesus.

The word "advent" is a Latin word meaning "to come to." It refers to the first coming of Jesus to us as an infant. God-made-man left Heaven and took our human nature and flesh to dwell among us. It also refers to our coming to Him. We come to Jesus in our prayer, when we come to church, and when we serve Him in the poor. In all things, we should come to Jesus just as He is always there for us.

As this is a new year, it is appropriate to make new year's resolutions. I suggest making spiritual resolutions to help prepare one's heart for receiving our Lord at His birth on Christmas Day. If the habit of praying daily is not a thing for you, start with that. Pray for five minutes every morning, evening, and night, and increase the amount of time by one minute every week until you form the habit.

If you regularly pray daily, then this Advent might be a time to do some form of penance. Advent is known as a mini-Lent, and not so long ago there was a fast for it. Pick something to abstain from like coffee or sweets (something I should do). Christmas is about making room for our Lord Jesus so that our hearts are not like the inn right before His birth, full with no room for Him.

Do not let this Advent season go to waste! It is such a spiritually beautiful season! My opinion is that we should not rush ahead to the very end, meaning Christmas. Advent is a season of preparation for Christmas, and so let us prepare by first focusing on His Second Coming (the first two weeks) and then focus on how God worked in history that set the stage for the coming of His Son. In preparation for this, we should set aside the "Christmas spirit" and first have an "Advent spirit." Remain joyful this Advent season, but remember that to feast well we must first fast and prepare well.

ONGOING FUNDRAISERS FOR SACRED HEART SCHOOL SCRIP



Clean our rooms and house!


Dress up in a princess gown or as a saint.
